While there, he also served as a presenter to the Ontario Principals' Council. Previously, Mr. McLean was Principal of Special Projects for the Upper Canada District School Board in Brockville, Ontario, where he led an implementation of Dashboard Metrics (SkopusTM, a data analysis tool and SkoVisionTM, an electronic school improvement/success planning software) and developed and implemented a Board-wide Inclusive Technology Strategy.
