The Centers of Medicaid & Medicare Services (CMS) recently provided guidance to state Medicaid agencies (SMA) that they would no longer require independent verification and validation (IV&V) to support modernization efforts. Key differences between QA and IV&V

Purpose and Focus

- QA focuses on continuous improvement throughout the project lifecycle, proactively building quality into processes, collaborating with clients to define expectations, and leveraging standards and metrics to ensure projects meet quality requirements.
- IV&V is an objective third-party service that reviews, analyzes, and tests software or hardware to ensure it meets its intended purpose. It focuses on verifying that the correct system is built according to requirements and that those requirements are suitable for the product's intended use.

Approach

- QA takes a proactive approach by defining and measuring quality using data metrics and indicators, and continuously improving processes based on feedback and assessments.
- IV&V takes an objective periodic approach to verify and validate processes and outputs against industry standards and best practices. It provides independent oversight and validation without incorporating continuous improvement aspects.



Role in Quality Management

- QA is part of the internal quality management processes, working alongside quality control (QC) to ensure quality standards are met and maintained.
- IV&V is an external, standalone process that provides objective assessments and validations, serving as an independent check on the quality and correctness of the system.


