


## Assisting California's Efforts to Integrate, Streamline, and Continuously Improve Offender Management Systems and Operations



## **The Opportunity**

In 2009, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) officially launched the multi-year Strategic Offender Management System (SOMS) project to transition all adult offender management processes for institutions and parole from over 50 legacy systems to a single, integrated offender management system. At the time, many of CDCR's management processes were paper-based, manual, and labor-intensive; as such, the SOMS implementation, which automated many of those inefficient manual processes, also involved a significant change management effort.

Further, when the SOMS project transitioned from system customization and implementation to the SOMS program which included daily operations addressing mandated business requirements, such as sentence calculation and gender identity, CDCR selected trusted partner Public Consulting Group (PCG) to ensure success of the developing program.

## The Solution

With support from PCG over the initial SOMS project lifecycle, CDCR was able to modify, customize, and implement the Electronic Offender Management Information System (eOMIS) and an electronic records management system (ERMS). Throughout the evolution of the SOMS program, PCG provided procurement and project management services which ultimately has included testing, organizational change management, business analysis, training, and deployment support services. This partnership continues to thrive as the CDCR and PCG partnership have successfully met every challenge placed before them.

Key deliverables that PCG has helped provide to CDCR and the SOMS program include:



New system functionality for tracking offender grievances in 2020 and new modules for property in 2021



Development of a new web-based offender sentence calculation solution (CalcIT) that includes implementation of CDCR's new sentence calculation methodology

Improve the user experience so individuals can easily access integrated, high-quality offender management data when they need it, where they need it, and at all stages of the offender's life cycle



Maintain effective, open communication and engagement with program stakeholders



Identify and implement process improvements more efficiently to scale



Respond quickly to program and policy changes

The PCG team continues to play a significant role in the development of a new release of CalcIT, CDCR's automated offender release date sentence calculator. Calculating a single offender release date is a complex semi-manual process that takes case records analysts anywhere from 20 minutes to multiple hours to complete. With CalcIT, case records analysts will have a tool that will complete the same calculation in a few seconds! CalcIT offers staff consistent application of California's complex sentencing rules, increased efficiency and accuracy of calculations, reduced labor-intensive manual processes, and improved the user experience for case records staff. After being initially implemented in the spring of 2021 with great success, the CalcIT project was extended with the modification and enhancement of business rules to support changes in California's calculation methodology with an anticipated rollout in 2024.
